

# How To Complete a Score Card

1. Please print legibly.
2. List player names alphabetically, last names 1st and include full 1st names.
3. Circle the Tee from which you played.
4. Check your scores carefully, and adjust for ESC per the chart below, for posting purposes.

## **NOTES:**

### **Hole All Putts**

For SHWGC Play Days, all putts must be holed, unless a player's score for a particular hole is not to be used, such as in a best ball or eclectic (turkey shoot) competition. If a player fails to hole out at any hole and does not correct her mistake before making a stroke on the next teeing ground, or in the case of the last hole of the round, before she leaves the putting green, she is disqualified.

### **Scoring Holes Not Played**

The score for a hole not played is par for that hole plus the player's handicap strokes for that hole. If 13 out of 18 holes are played you are required to post.

### **Scoring Holes Not Completed**

When a player's score is not being used on a hole for that day's game and she picks up her ball before completing the hole, the score she should use for posting purposes is the lower of 1) the number of strokes already played plus the strokes most likely needed to complete the hole for that player (most likely score) or 2) Equitable Stroke Control (the maximum allowed for a given handicap). An "x" should be placed next to that hole's score on the score card.

5. Date the card.
6. One player signs as "scorer", and another as "attest".

7. Place the completed score card in the bottom drawer, under the computer, in our pro shop except on Wednesday, during our Club Playdays, when your card must be turned in to the supervising Pro in our pro-shop.

8. If you make a mistake when posting, please send an e-mail, to the Handicap Chair, with the incorrect and correct information, and she will correct your records for you.

9. The posting of your scores is on the honor system. Please post within 24 hours after play, whether home or away. Post **all** rounds played according to the *Rules of Golf*. "If 13 or more holes are played, the player must post an 18 hole score. If 7-12 holes are played, the player must post a 9 hole score. In either case, scores for unplayed holes must be recorded as par plus any handicap strokes that the player is entitled to receive on the unplayed holes".

10. Posting all scores and "Peer Review" are integral components of our membership as a club, in good standing, in the SCGA.
