

Questions and answers regarding using golf genius, rules and scoring....

- 1) You are using golf genius to record an 18 hole round of golf. You play 9 holes and don't feel well and decide to go home. What do you do about the remaining 9 holes?
- a) put an X on every hole
 - b) leave the rest of the holes blank
 - c) put a 0 on each hole

Answerb) leave the rest of the holes blank.

2) You are using golf genius and you are in a competition that requires only 3 scores of the 4 players. You are having a horrific hole and you decide to pick up. What do you put in golf genius for a score?

- a) 0
- b) X
- c) Nothing

Answerb) the correct answer is X.

3) you are playing in the club championship and the net tournament. You are having a really bad hole. What score do you put in?

- a) X
- b) You must finish the hole and put in your actual score
- c) Your max score

Answerb) the correct answer is you must finish the hole and put in an actual score.

4) You are playing a match with a partner. Your partner holes out for a 4. You are putting for a 5 and you do not pop or have a stroke on this hole and you are approximately 20 feet away. For speed of play, you can pick up. What score do you put in?

- a) 5
- b) 4 like your partner
- c) 6

Answerc) the correct answer is 6. If you are more than 5 feet from the hole but on the green, you take the most likely or presumed score. In this case it is unlikely you will one putt so you take a 6. Inside of 5 feet would allow you to take a 5.

5) You are playing a round of golf using golf genius. You think you have saved all the scores and you go home and realize somehow the scores are not correct. What do you do?

- a) get in touch with the tournament co-ordinator or handicap chair
- b) Nothing
- c) Call the proshop

Answera) let your tournament co-ordinator (Goldie) or handicap chair (Marg) know asap.

6) if you are using golf genius, is it necessary to have a paper copy as well?

- a) no
- b) Yes
- c) It's up to you

Answerb) it is recommended you have a paper copy to cross check when the round is over. Whom ever is inputting the scores could inadvertently press an incorrect number. In many tournaments a paper copy is still requested and must be attested by the player.

7) You are playing a fun round. Do you have to post a score?

- a) no you are just having fun
- b) Up to you
- c) Yes

Answerc) is the correct answer. Absolutely all scores must be posted.

8) do I post scores when I play the north course as it is only a par 3/4?

- a) no
- b) Yes, but only if I want to
- c) Yes

Answerc) is the correct answer, playing the north course is now a post-able round. Make sure you have the right tees when posting.

9) You posted a score and realize a couple of days later that you posted from the wrong tees. What do you do?

- a) nothing
- b) Send an email to your handicap chair
- c) Phone someone

Answerb) is the correct answer. She has the ability to change the tees, date or score if need be.
